UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

Steven T. Mnuchin (Cal. No. 12)

Ordered, That following Leader remarks on Friday, February 10, 2017, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Steven T. Mnuchin, of California to be Secretary of the Treasury post-cloture; *further*, That the time during morning business, recess, and adjournment count post-cloture on the nomination. (*Feb. 10, 2017.*)

Ordered, That following Leader remarks on Monday, February 13, 2017, Rule XXII notwithstanding, there be up to 7 hours of debate remaining on the nomination of Steven T. Mnuchin, of California to be Secretary of the Treasury; that following disposition of the Mnuchin nomination the Senate proceed to consideration of the nomination of David J. Shulkin, of Pennsylvania, to be Secretary of Veterans Affairs.

Ordered further, that there be 10 minutes of debate, equally divided in the usual form, and that following the use or yielding back of time, the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination, with no intervening action or debate; that if confirmed, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table; the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions; and that no further motion be in order.

Ordered further, That, following Leader remarks on Tuesday, February 14, 2017, the Senate proceed to consideration of the nomination of Linda McMahon, of CT, to be Administrator of the Small Business Administration.

Ordered further, That the time until 11 a.m. be equally divided in the usual form; that following the use or yielding back of time, the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination with no intervening action or debate; that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid on the table; the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions; and that no further motion be in order.
