## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

### Neil M. Gorsuch (Cal. No. 33)

*Ordered,* That following Leader remarks on Thursday, April 6, 2017, the time until the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Neil M. Gorsuch, of Colorado, to be an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States be equally divided between the Senator from Iowa (Mr. Grassley) and the Senator from California (Mrs. Feinstein) or their designees.

*Ordered further,* That with respect to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the Gorsuch nomination, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Apr. 5, 2017.*)

### Sonny Perdue (Cal. No. 31)

*Ordered,* That following Leader remarks on Monday, April 24, 2017, the Senate proceed to executive session for consideration of the nomination of Sonny Perdue, of Georgia, to be Secretary of Agriculture.

*Ordered further,* That the time until 5:30 p.m. be equally divided in the usual form, and that at 5:30 p.m., the Senate vote on confirmation with no intervening action or debate, and that if confirmed, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Apr. 5, 2017.*)
