UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Ordered, That following Leader remarks on Thursday, March 1, 2018, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of A. Marvin Quattlebaum, Jr., of South Carolina, to be United States District Judge for the District of South Carolina.

Ordered further, That at 11:45 a.m., notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII, the Senate vote on confirmation of the Quattlebaum nomination, and that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

Ordered further, That following disposition of the Quattlebaum nomination, the Senate vote on the motions to invoke cloture on the nominations of Karen Gren Scholer, of Texas, to be United States District Judge for the Northern District of Texas and Tilman Eugene Self III, of Georgia, to be United States District Judge for the Middle District of Georgia, and that following the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the Self nomination, the time until 1:30 p.m., be equally divided prior to the vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Terry A. Doughty, of Louisiana, to be United States District Judge for the Western District of Louisiana.

Ordered further, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the Scholer, Self, and Doughty nominations, the mandatory quorums required under Rule XXII be waived.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on any of the nominations, the post-cloture time be yielded back, the confirmation votes, in the order invoked, occur at 5:30 p.m., on Monday, March 5, 2018, and that if confirmed, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid on the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.
