## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

*Ordered*, That following Leader remarks on Tuesday, June 5, 2018, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Robert Earl Wier, of Kentucky, to be United States District Judge for the Eastern District of Kentucky.

*Ordered further*, That at 11 a.m., notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII, all post-cloture time on the Wier nomination be considered expired and the Senate vote on the confirmation of the nomination.

*Ordered further*, That if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid on the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the nominations of Fernando Rodriguez, Jr., of Texas, to be United States District Judge for the Southern District of Texas and Annemarie Carney Axon, of Alabama, to be United States District Judge for the Northern District of Alabama, the mandatory quorums required under Rule XXII be waived. (*May 24, Jun 4, 2018.*)

When a notice of intent to object is given to the appropriate leader, or their designee, and such notice is submitted for inclusion in the Congressional Record and the Senate Executive Calendar, or following the objection to a unanimous consent to proceeding to, and, or disposition of, matters relating to nominations and treaties on their behalf, it shall be placed in the section of the Senate Executive Calendar entitled "Notice of Intent to Object". (S. Res. 28, 112<sup>th</sup> Congress)
