## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

**Bernard L. McNamee (Cal. No. 1153)**  
**Kathleen Laura Kraninger (Cal. No. 1064)**

*Ordered,* That following Leader remarks on Thursday, December 6, 2018, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the nomination of Bernard L. McNamee, of Virginia, to be a Member of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission for the remainder of the term expiring June 30, 2020, with the time until 12 noon equally divided between the two Leaders or their designees.

*Ordered further,* That at 12 noon, notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII, all post-cloture time on the McNamee nomination expire, and that if the nomination is confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.

*Ordered further,* That following the disposition of the McNamee nomination, the Senate resume consideration of the nomination of Kathleen Laura Kraninger, of Ohio, to be Director, Bureau of Consumer Financial Protection for a term of five years, and the time be equally divided in the usual form until 1:45 p.m.

*Ordered further,* That following the use or yielding back of that time the Senate vote on the Kraninger nomination, and that if the nomination is confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Dec. 5, 2018.*)
