UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Protocol to the North Atlantic Treaty of 1949 on the Accession of the Republic of North Macedonia (T. Cal. No. 5) Andrew P. Bremberg (Cal. No. 441)

Ordered, That following Leader remarks on Monday, October 21, 2019, the Senate proceed to executive session and resume consideration of the Protocol to the North Atlantic Treaty of 1949 on the Accession of the Republic of North Macedonia.

Ordered further, That at 5:30 p.m., notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII, the cloture motions on the Protocol to the North Atlantic Treaty of 1949 on the Accession of the Republic of North Macedonia and the nomination of Andrew P. Bremberg, of Virginia, to be Representative of the United States of America to the Office of the United Nations and Other International Organizations in Geneva, with the rank of Ambassador ripen.

Ordered further, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the above treaty and nomination, the mandatory quorum calls required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Oct. 17, 2019.*)
