UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

Alejandro Nicholas Mayorkas (Cal. No. 4)

Ordered, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Monday, February 1, 2021, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Alejandro Nicholas Mayorkas, of the District of Columbia, to be Secretary of Homeland Security.

Ordered further, That the vote on confirmation be at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, February 1, 2021. (*Jan. 27, 28, 2021.*)

Peter Paul Montgomery Buttigieg (Cal. No. 5)

Ordered, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Tuesday, February 2, 2021, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Peter Paul Montgomery Buttigieg, of Indiana, to be Secretary of Transportation.

Ordered further, That the time until 12 noon be equally divided between the two Leaders or their designees, and that at 12 noon, the Senate vote without intervening action or debate on the nomination; that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions, and the Senate resume legislative session.
