UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

Linda Thomas-Greenfield (Cal. No. 10)

Ordered, That following the reading of Washington's Farewell Address on Monday, February 22, 2021, the Senate resume consideration of the nomination of Linda Thomas-Greenfield, of Louisiana, to be the Representative of the United States of America to the United Nations, with the rank and status of the Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, and the Representative of the United States of America in the Security Council of the United Nations.

Ordered further, That at 5:30 p.m., the cloture motions on the nominations of Linda Thomas-Greenfield, of Louisiana, to be the Representative of the United States of America to the United Nations, with the rank and status of the Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, and the Representative of the United States of America in the Security Council of the United Nations and Linda Thomas-Greenfield, of Louisiana, to be Representative of the United States of America to the Sessions of the General Assembly of the United Nations during her tenure of service as Representative of the United States of America to the United Nations ripen.

Ordered further, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the Thomas-Greenfield nominations, the mandatory quorum calls required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Feb. 13, 2021.*)

Thomas J. Vilsack (Cal. No. 7)

Ordered, That at a time to be determined on Tuesday, February 23, 2021, notwithstanding the provisions of Rule XXII, the Senate proceed to executive session and the Senate proceed to the immediate consideration of the nomination of Thomas J. Vilsack, of Iowa, to be Secretary of Agriculture.

Ordered further, That there be 20 minutes for debate, equally divided between the two Leaders or their designees and that the Senate vote without intervening action or debate on the nomination; that if confirmed, the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions.
