UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Lisa O. Monaco (Cal. No. 57)
Gary Gensler (Cal. No. 34)

Ordered, That at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, April 19, 2021, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Lisa O. Monaco, of the District of Columbia, to be Deputy Attorney General and the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination.

Ordered further, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the Monaco nomination and the nomination of Gary Gensler, of Maryland, to be a Member of the Securities and Exchange Commission for a term expiring June 5, 2026, the mandatory quorum calls required under Rule XXII be waived.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked, all post-cloture time be considered expired, and the vote on confirmation occur at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Republican Leader on Tuesday, April 20, 2021.

Ordered further, That following the cloture vote, the Senate resume legislative session. (*Apr. 15, 2021.*)
