Ordered, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Wednesday, February 16, 2022, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Celeste Ann Wallander, of Maryland, to be an Assistant Secretary of Defense.

Ordered further, That at 11:30 a.m., the cloture motions filed on the Wallander nomination and the nomination of David A. Honey, of Virginia, to be Deputy Under Secretary of Defense ripen, and the Senate vote on the motions to invoke cloture on the Wallander and Honey nominations consecutively and in the order listed.

Ordered further, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the Wallander and Honey nominations, the mandatory quorum calls required under Rule XXII be waived.

Ordered further, That if cloture is invoked on either of the nominations, the confirmation votes occur at 3:30 p.m. in the order in which cloture was invoked.

Ordered further, That if any nominations are confirmed during Wednesday's session, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Feb. 14, 15, 2022.*)
