## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Monday, September 12, 2022, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Lara E. Montecalvo, of Rhode Island, to be United States Circuit Judge for the First Circuit.

*Ordered further*, That at 5:30 p.m., the Senate vote on confirmation of the nomination of Salvador Mendoza, Jr., of Washington, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Ninth Circuit.

*Ordered further*, That following disposition of the Mendoza nomination, the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Arianna J. Freeman, of Pennsylvania, to be United States Circuit Judge for the Third Circuit.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the motions to invoke cloture on the Freeman and Montecalvo nominations, the mandatory quorum calls required under Rule XXII be waived.

*Ordered further*, That if any nominations are confirmed during Monday's session, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Sep. 6, 8, 2022.*)

**David P. Pecoske (Cal. No. 1096) (PN2063)**

*Ordered*, That at a time to be determined by the Majority Leader, in consultation with the Republican Leader, the Senate proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of David P. Pecoske, of Maryland, to be Administrator of the Transportation Security Administration for a term of five years.
