## UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENTS

### **Harry Coker, Jr. (Cal. No. 410) (PN876)**

*Ordered*, That upon the conclusion of morning business on Tuesday, December 12, 2023, the Senate proceed to executive session to resume consideration of the nomination of Harry Coker, Jr., of Kansas, to be National Cyber Director.

*Ordered further*, That at 11:45 a.m., the cloture motion with respect to the Coker nomination ripen.

*Ordered further*, That with respect to the motion to invoke cloture on the Coker nomination, the mandatory quorum call required under Rule XXII be waived.

*Ordered further*, That following the cloture vote on the Coker nomination, the Senate recess until 2:15 p.m. to allow for the weekly caucus meetings.

*Ordered further*, That if cloture is invoked on the Coker nomination, all time be considered expired at 2:15 p.m.

*Ordered further*, That following the confirmation vote on the Coker nomination, there be up to fifteen minutes for debate prior to the cloture vote on the conference report to accompany H.R. 2670.

*Ordered further*, That if any nominations are confirmed during Tuesday's session, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table, and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Dec. 7, 11, 2023.*)
